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










Pre-mobility / pre-procedures

- ✓ Where to go according to the destinations on offer and with my personal situation in mind?
 I am Isabel, International Relations Technician at the University of Jaén and, I have a 91% disability
- ✓ Being accepted, which is an outstanding point.
- ✓ Finding a personal assistant to come with me to KA-171 Staff Training Mobility to help me.





Documentation

- ✓ Application for the call
- ✓ As I have already said, to be accepted.
- ✓ To receive the acceptance letter
- ✓ To make the LA
- ✓ To sign my grant agreement
- ✓ To apply for the special needs grant, What is it? Travel, accommodation and maintenance costs as well as salary for my personal assistant.





If it is difficult to find a person who leaves their life behind for a week to come and help me, it is even more difficult to find a person who fits the characteristics of the trip. However, desire, effort, empathy, positive attitude, friendship & family & colleagues, good work and practices, make all this possible!



Travel organization and solving unexpected problems

In my last Staff Mobility for Training Programme (Erasmus+ KA171) at the Shortwood Teachers' Collage in Jamaica, the arrangements were as follows:

- ✓ <u>Plane ticket</u>: request assistance for people with reduced mobility and check with the airline whether my wheelchair is suitable for travelling with them.
- ✓ Booking an <u>accessible accommodation</u> (challenging places sometimes!)
- Transfers
- ✓ <u>Travel documents</u> and at this point I would like to tell an <u>anecdote</u> that happened to me on my last mobility to Jamaica: Visa, ESTA, etc.
- ✓ Organisation of <u>work and visits</u> to the staff at the hosting university.
- ✓ <u>Helping</u> to the host university <u>to organise</u> my <u>cultural visits or trips</u> due to my personal circumstances.
- etc.




