

International credit mobility

MAIN FEATURES

- Short-term higher education mobility for students, academic and administrative staff
- All levels: Bachelor, Master and PhD candidates for African students (only staff and PhD candidates from Europe to Africa)
- Mobility in any subject or academic discipline
- Duration: 2-3 years projects
- Also supports traineeships for students and training for staff
- Study periods and traineeships of 2 12 months (5 days to 2 months for staff)
- Blended mobility (physical mobility of 5 30 days + virtual component)





International Credit mobility in practice

- The applicant is a higher education institution in Europe
- This action is managed by the Erasmus+ National Agency where the applicant is located

- The European University and its partner institution in a non-associated country sign an inter-institutional agreement.
- A grant agreement links the European University and its E+ national agency.
- A learning learning/mobility agreement links the participant to the sending and hosting institutions.







Organisational support

EUR 500/participant

Individual support

EUR 700-900/month for students and EUR 140-180/day for staff


EUR 79/day up to the 14th day of activity and EUR 56/day from 15th to the 30th day of activity in case of blended mobility

Contribution to travel costs

EUR 20-1500, depending on distance travelled

Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters (EMJM)

Coordinator can be in Africa

University perspective

- Integrated Masters of excellence offered by a consortium of universities. At least 3 partners from 3 countries (including 2 European ones)
- Jointly delivered programmes with study in 2+ countries, of which at least one must be an EU Member State or third country associated to the programme
- Aim to attract the best students in the world through EU-funded scholarships
- 6-year project 4 cohorts of students

New sub-action, supporting the design of high-level study programmes at master level

Autonomous action (no automatic transition to Erasmus Mundus Joint Master)

Strong integration between partners necessary (curriculum, management, student services, accreditation...)

15 months project

Lump sum contribution amounting to 55 000 €



Capacity building for Higher Education

160 M€ for SSA over 6 years !

- Develop and adapt curricula, in terms of content and teaching/learning methods
- Support university-enterprise cooperation
- Work on upskilling of academic and administrative staff
- Reform of governance and management systems at national, regional or HEI level
- Foster internationalisation of universities in research, scientific and technological innovation
- Introduce Bologna-type reforms at institutional, national or regional level
- Develop new approaches and tools for policy making and monitoring

The Applicant can be in Europe <u>or in an</u> <u>African Country.</u>

Minimum 4 organisations Minimum 1 HEI from 2 Programme Countries and 2 HEIs from one or more Non Associated Countries.

The number of organisations from Programme countries should not be higher than the number of organisations from Non Associated countries



One action – 3 strands to better answer needs

FOSTERING ACCESS TO COOPERATION IN HIGHER EDUCATION

- Smaller scope projects
- Focused on higher education institutions.
- Designed for newcomers to the programme, less involved countries/regions, and for disadvantaged target groups.
- Enhance management capacities, quality of education and accessibility
- Budget between 200 000 and 400 000€
- 2-3 years.

PARTNERSHIPS FOR TRANSFORMATION IN HIGHER EDUCATION

- Focused on higher education institutions and local actors linked with industry
- Designed to have a larger impact on innovation, university/business relations and institutional governance.
- Promoting reforms in universities
- Budget between 400 000 and 800 000€
- 2-3 years.

STRUCTURAL REFORM PROJECTS

- Focus on macro level policy reforms
- Involve national competent authorities, HE sector and institutions
- Support Policy making (expert advice, training, creation of representative bodies ...)
- Develop Implementation of tools (Quality assurance, credit systems, accreditation procedures, recognition...)
- Support Internationalisation (Bologna type reforms, surveys and studies...)
- Budget between 800 000 and 1M€
- 3-4 years.



Focus on European integration studies:

- Teaching and research
 - Modules: 3 years project / min. 40 h/year
 - Chairs: 3 years project / min. 90 h/year
 - Centres of Excellence
- Networks for policy debate with academic world



2021-2022 2 modules selected for Sub-Saharan Africa involving Nigeria and Somalia



Capacity building on Vocational Education and Training

They aim to support the relevance, accessibility, and responsiveness of VET institutions and systems in third countries not associated to the Programme as a driver of sustainable socio-economic development.



Build capacity of VET providers to strengthen cooperation between private and public stakeholders in the field of VET for demandoriented and opportunitydriven VET interventions;

Improve the quality and responsiveness of VET to economic and social developments to enhance the labour market relevance of skills provision;

Align VET provision to local, regional and national development strategies



CBVET – Main features

Applicant is based in Europe

At least 4 full partners from a minimum of 3 countries:

At least 1 organisation from 2 different EU Member States and associated countries

+ a least 2 organisations from at least 1 eligible country not associated to the Programme Duration:1, 2 or 3 years

EU grant per project: Min 100 000 € - Max 400 000 €





Virtual exchanges under E+ from 2021

Applicant has to be located in Europe

- maximum of 500,000 € (with 200 € max per participant)
- minimum 2 HEI or youth organisations from 2 EU Member States or associated countries + 2 from Sub-Saharan Africa

 Online people-to-people activities that promote intercultural dialogue and soft skills development without physical mobility.

- Take place in small groups always moderated by a trained facilitator
- Be easily integrated into youth (non-formal education) projects or higher education courses
