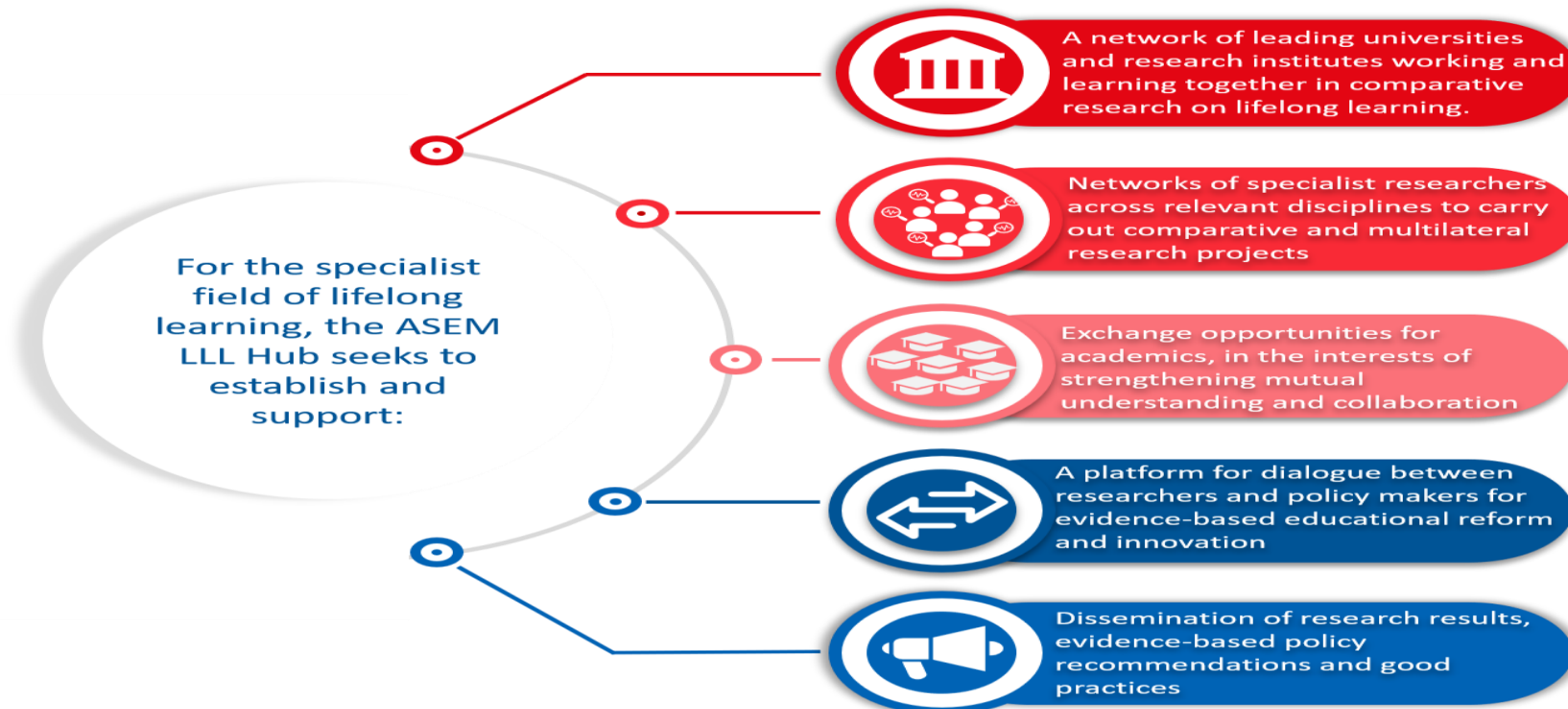

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- The ASEM Education and Research Hub for Lifelong Learning (ASEM LLL Hub) is an official **network for university cooperation in Lifelong Learning Research between Asia and Europe**. The timeline below provides an overview of the milestones in the history of the ASEM LLL Hub.
- The Hub brings together more than 100 researchers in its **7 research networks**, senior representatives of 36 universities in its University Council and Senior Officials from 25 ministries of education and five flagship international organizations.
