#### What is ICM?


- Launched in the 2014-2020 programme to fund short-term mobility of students and staff between Programme and Partner countries
- Manifold benefits for individuals and institutions:
  - Key skills & competences, professional development, enhanced employability, teaching methods, etc.
  - Increased capacities, attractiveness & internationalisation; improved quality of higher education




#### How does it work?

- Global action: the world is divided into regions, which have different budgets allocated per year

International credit mobility 2014-2020 **~270k** planned short-term staff and student mobilities




## ICM budget

## Activities supported (I)

- Short-term higher education mobility for students, academic and administrative staff
- All levels: Bachelor, Master and PhD candidates
- Mobility in any subject or academic discipline
- Also supports traineeships for students and training for staff
- Study periods and traineeships of 2 12 months
- Blended mobility (physical mobility of 5 30 days + virtual component)



## Activities supported (II)

- All partners in an ICM project can send and host students and staff as described in their submitted project and provided that a relevant grant has been secured.
- For certain countries, Bachelor/Master student mobility is only possible from third countries to Europe this means third country universities can send but not host.

- European partners may use a part of their **intra-European mobility budget** to fund their students mobility to restricted countries under ICM.





#### **Organisational support**

EUR 500/participant





EUR 700-900/month for students and EUR 148-190/day for staff

EUR 79/day up to the 14th day of activity and EUR 56/day from 15th to the 30th day of activity in case of blended mobility




#### **Contribution to travel costs**

EUR 20-1735, depending on distance travelled



## Who can apply and how? (I)


- Higher Education Institutions in the Programme countries
- The ICM project in their application contains the countries and partner universities they intend to cooperate with, as well as their cooperation plan in each region






## Who can apply and how? (II)

- Upon successfully passing the established quality criteria, they will be allocated an ICM grant spread in different regional envelopes
- For every partnership with a secured budget, an Inter-Institutional Agreement is needed between the main applicant in Europe and every partner university in third countries before mobilities can start.

- Got mail from the International office of UMA Spain about approval of 4 Staff and 8 Master mobilities











# Call for application at home university /Selection criteria

- Received the mail from the UMA international office about the mobilities
- Announced the mobilities on the university portal
- Also, I delivered the awareness seminar on how to apply
- Received 5 applications in staff and 24 for masters student's mobility
- VC formed the evaluation committee
- The evaluation was sent to the international office UMA, Spain



## Call for application at home university /Selection criteria

- Host institute (UMA) finalized the selection with the approval of 2 staff mobilities and 4 student mobilities. Also, one staff and three students were kept on the waiting list
- All the students were guided about their Credit transfer and learning agreement, accommodation, etc.
- Preferred students to complete their master's research/thesis work at UMA
- Upon return, the university equivalence committee approved their credit transfer





### Students feedback

- Have excellent experience working in an enabling environment
- Improved communication, language, and inter-cultural skills and gained soft skills highly valued by future employers
- Professional development, enhanced employability, and good research guidance.
- Most of them got good job opportunities as well as offers to do PhD from Europe.




## faculty feedback
