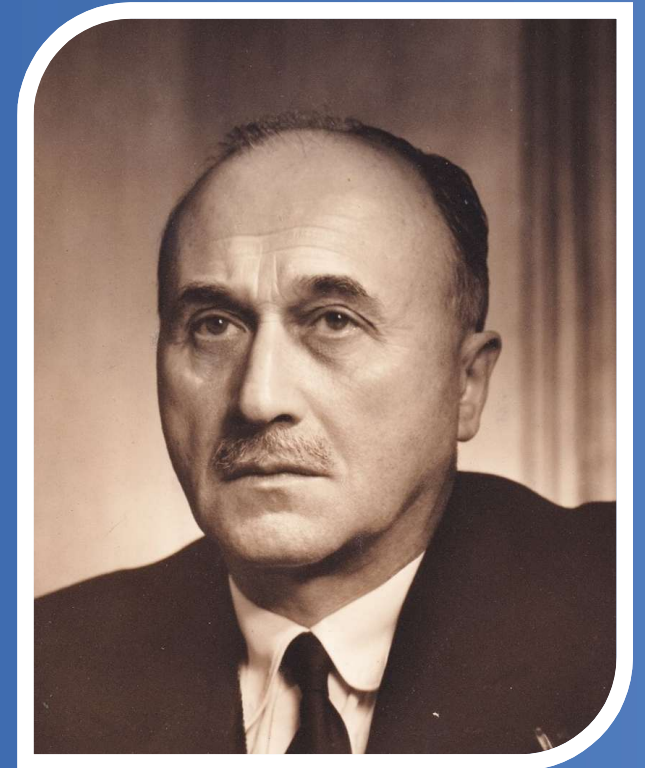

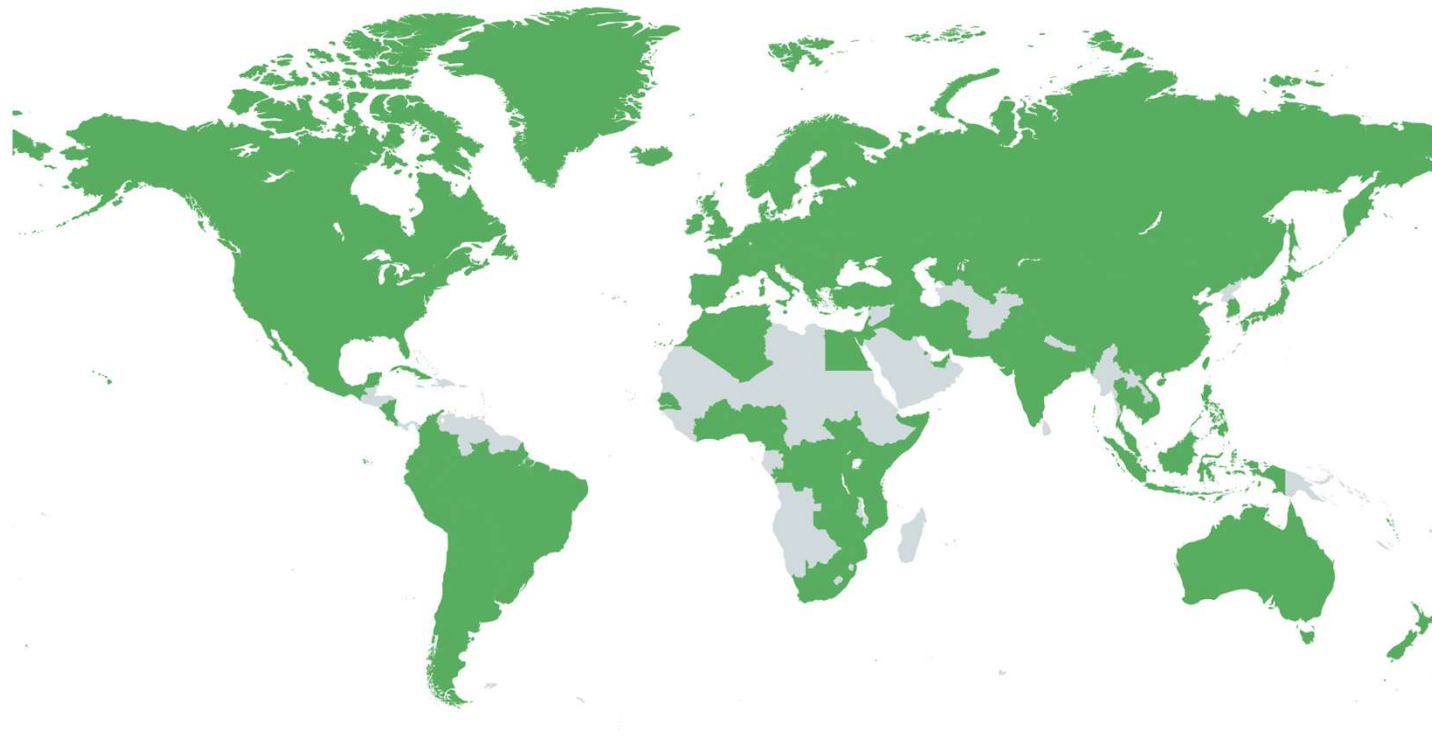

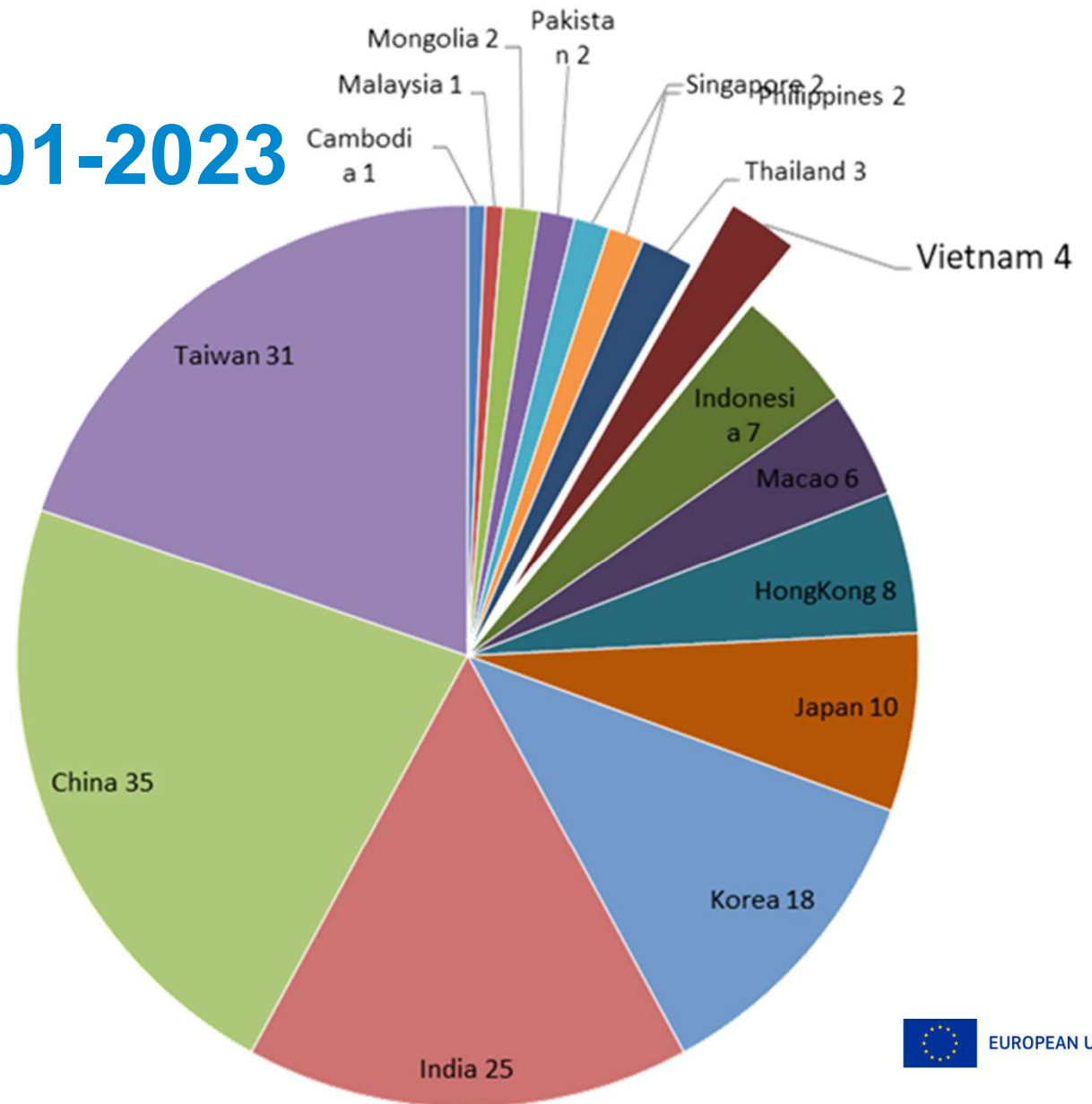


Jean Monnet Actions: a worldwide network since 1989

Scope of Jean Monnet actions

- **EU Dimension Focus**

Jean Monnet activities should **promote active European citizenship and the founding values of the European Union** of respect for human dignity, freedom, democracy, equality, the rule of law and respect for human rights, including the rights of persons belonging to minorities (Article 2 of the Treaty on European Union).

- **EU Policy Focus**

Jean Monnet actions should **contribute to spreading knowledge about how these policies can benefit the daily lives of citizens in the EU and/or abroad**, and/or how these can influence the policymaking system, in similar fields, either at the Member State level or abroad at a national, regional or global level. A link should be displayed between the subject of the proposal and the relevant EU policy or topic(s).

- **Public Diplomacy Focus**

Jean Monnet actions also strive to **function as a vector of public diplomacy towards third countries**. They should promote EU values and enhance the visibility of what the European Union stands for and what it intends to achieve.

- **Teaching Focus**

Boost the offer of teaching, learning and research on **Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM)** with linkages to the related European Union policies.

- **Promoting excellence** in teaching and research in EU studies worldwide
- **Fostering dialogue** between academia and society, policymakers, civil servants, civil society, representatives of different levels of education, and the media
- **Generating knowledge and insights;** supporting EU policy-making, while strengthening the role of the EU within Europe and the world
- **Reaching new people;** going beyond academia and specialised audiences, bringing EU knowledge closer to society in the process
- **Functioning as a vector for public diplomacy** towards partner/third countries, promoting EU values while enhancing the visibility of its goals and achievements

- - Jean Monnet Network on external policy: EU-North America.

The proposed Module's activities relate to EU-Indo-Pacific relations, a topic that is destined to become central in the EU global presence as the recent Joint Communication on the EU's Indo-Pacific Strategy published by the EurThe proposed Module's activities relate to EU-Indo-Pacific relations, a topic that is destined to become central in the EU global presence as the recent Joint Communication on the EU's Indo-Pacific Strategy released by the European Commission and the EU High Representative on 16 September 2021 clearly underlines. Since the interest of the EU for the Indo-Pacific is very recent, the number of teaching courses and scientific contributions on this topic are still very narrow and the knowledge of students and the general public about it is even more limited. This is particularly true in the Indo-Pacific countries, like Thailand, where EU studies are not particularly diffused.

The Module's proposed activities tackle these three challenges: 1) they will significantly enrich the study of the EU at Burapha University, since no one of the courses offered at this university addresses the EU political system, 2) they will offer learning opportunities for Thai students, local and regional policymakers and civil society increasingly involved in the process of globalization about the EU Indo-Pacific relations; 3) they will contribute to the understanding of the EU and EU-Indo-Pacific relations by leading to the publication of the first handbook in Thai about the EU political system and a second book in English on the EU-Indo-Pacific relations.

The activities of the proposed Jean Monnet Module are:

- 40 hours of teaching on EU Politics, EU Foreign Policy, and EU-Indo-Pacific relations;
- 10 hours of lectures on specific topics related to EU foreign policy and Indo-Pacific relations open to students, professors, civil society and the general public;
- the first handbook in Thai dealing with EU politics;
- a book in English about EU-Indo-Pacific relations.
